Maastricht Treaty	
Power institution: Council and European Council	Decision: unanimous
Binding: no strong commitments \rightarrow unanimity	Funds: European Communities → unanimity

• Intergovernmental method \rightarrow Denmark Opted out

- Creation High Representative CFSP
- Common Strategies
- ESDP (not in treaty)
 - Proactive crisis management
- Intergovernmental method → minor supranational points
 - Changes possible due to geopolitical context (instability Balkans)





Lisbon treaty		
Power institution	Decision	
Binding	Funds	

- Abolishment pillar structure
- Commission joint proposals to Council (but only external action)

"The Union shall respect the equality of Member States before the Treaties as well as their national identities, inherent in their fundamental structures, political and constitutional, inclusive of regional and local self-government. It shall respect their essential State functions, including ensuring the territorial integrity of the State, maintaining law and order and safeguarding national security. In particular, national security remains the sole responsibility of each Member State.

 - 23 MS \rightarrow Coordination
 - Binding decisions
 - Administrative expenditure \rightarrow Union budget

Binding

Almost no influence

- Danger
 - Easily reversible when outside treaties
- If EU wants to make CSDP truly more supranational
 → give EU institutions more official power by altering treaties
- EU collaboration is the only way forward
- Non-collaboration is understandable as no real CFSP
