# for the International Winter Semester 2019



## 1. Introduction

### **1.1 Pre-conditions for Participation in the International Semester:**

- Only military <u>Officer Cadets</u> with an appropriate military background are foreseen to participate in the <u>entire</u> International Winter Semester. Exceptions from this rule are to be negotiated on a case-to-case basis.
- The Officer Cadets' pre-conditions for participation in the entire International Semester are:
  - English language according to point 1.2.
  - National medical certificate.
  - Fulfilling the respective national physical standards of the sending institution.
  - <u>**Basic</u>** managerial and leadership competences, focused on basic tactical level (platoon or equivalent).</u>
- <u>Basic</u> negotiation and problem solving skills.
- Ability to plan, organise and accept responsibility.
- <u>Additional</u> Civilian Students and military Officer Cadets may participate in selected classes/modules according to point 2.1.

### 1.2 Language:

- The entire International Semester is offered in English language.
- The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) Level
   B1 or NATO STANAG Level 2 is a requirement for participation.
- The English level will be tested at the end of the first week. Those Cadets / Students who will not fulfil the minimum requirements will be repatriated.



## **1.3 Contents/Duration:**

- The entire International Semester has 24 ECTS and lasts 3 months. This fulfils the requirements for ERASMUS+ support.
- Almost all the Common Modules, which are an integral part of the Austrian accreditation, are also part of the International Semester.

## 1.4 Applications:

- Applications (use the form of Annex 1) are to be sent to: <u>harald.gell@bmlv.gv.at</u> (in cc to: <u>thermilak.international@bmlv.gv.at</u>).
- Dates:
  - Latest day of reporting participants: 12<sup>th</sup> of July, 2019.
  - The International Semester starts on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019 and ends on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019.
  - Arrival day: 29<sup>th</sup> September 2019 (not earlier, not later).
  - Departure Day: to be negotiated on a case-to-case basis after the last classes in December 2019.
- A mixture of countries/institutions causes a better increase of intercultural competences; that is why a **maximum of 2 Cadets per institution** is desirable.
- The procedure for the assignment of places is: **first reported first booked**.

#### **1.5 Accommodation & Meals:**

- According to EMILYO-LoD 5 (framework), accommodation, meals, and other expenses in relation to the education are free of charge for members of <u>European Union</u> Basic Officer Education Institutions (<u>http://www.emilyo.eu/node/982</u>).
- For Non-EU Members the rules follow the bilateral regulations and contracts.



## 1.6 Permission for Stay

- According to national Austrian rules/law, the **permission of stay is to be requested** via the sending institutions' country national (military) diplomatic chain of command.
- A "Request for Visit (RfV)" is to be passed via the sending country's echelons to the sending country's embassy in Austria.
- Without this procedure, unfortunately Officer Cadets and civilian students do not receive a permission of stay by the Austrian Ministry of Defence and a participation in the international semester is not possible.
