The Implementation Group (IG) LOD7 Chairperson, LTCOL Paulo Machado, after verified the participants in the meeting, presented the Agenda and shared the presentation on VTC.

The Implementation Group (IG) chairman talked with the participants about the next International Military Academy Forum (IMAF), asking to Nicolae Balcescu Land Forces Academy representant, Ramona-Elena Herman if the Academy could assure the organization of IMAF in november, as planned. Because of the Covid19 was not possible to confirm. So, the Chairman asked to the representant of AWL Military University of Land Forces (AWL MULF) to coordinate the organization of IMAF2021, planned to be in Poland, with Romania.

The LOD7 Chairperson started to share the presentation with all and followed the agenda:

a) LoD 5 - Legal framework

The LOD7 chairperson announced the adoption of the legal framework from Lithuania, highlighting the importance of the signature of the Framework by all the Institutions and asked the participants to pass on the information to their Institution and to request its adoption via their chains of command.

b) LoD 6 - National implementation of the strategic communication programme

About European Union Military Academies Commandants Seminar (EUMACS) 2020, the LOD7 chairperson informed is scheduled to be held in Helmut Schmidt University of the Bundeswehr in Hamburg from 29-31 October 2020. The IG chairman confirmed it.

The EUMACS 2021 will take place in Lisbon, from 26 to 28 of may and the Portuguese Military Academy already started to plan it.

c) LoD 8 - Common modules/evaluations and offers

LOD7 chairperson asked to all participants to see the mobility offers in emilyo page because was actualized and they can find new AT and IT announced upcoming offers (www.emilyo.eu/node/878). This activities will have residential phase only if





the COVID-19 situation allows. A decision will be made before the deadline for registration.

Also, the LOD7 chairperson informed the participants about some items referred by LTCOL Spinelo:

- 1. ERASMUS Virtual Exchange: A new European Comission Project (2018-2020 pilot program) aims to expand the reach and scope of the Erasmus+ Program through virtual exchanges. A virtual Exchange is defined as a technology-enabled, facilitated, people-to-people education program sustained oven a given period. The Project is aimed at young people (18-30), and the virtual exchange format distinguishes itself from other forms of online learning in several ways:
- people-to-people interaction and dialogue;
- participants experiencing how to communicate and collaborate with their peers;
- soft skills (intercultural awareness, media and digital literacy, teamwork, etc.) are included in the learning goals or outcomes;
- learner-led concept.

Training materials for teachers and staff and other information available on the portal: www.europa.eu/youth/erasmusvirtual.

- 2. Virtual Mobility: The University of Turin, in cooperation with the IT Army Education and Training Command and School of Applied Military Studies, has opened up the start@unito project to all partner universities of the Emilyo programme (BOEIs) during COVID-19 crisis. It provides free online university courses, all of which are part of the university's graduate and undergraduate programmes and have been designed to encourage internationalisation processes. Courses can be freely accessed by anyone, using any type of device. Courses are self-paced. For those who intend to acquire ECTS credits, the final exam can be taken using a distance e-learning functionality. The programme dedicated to the field of security and defence is as follows:
- History of European Integration, 6 ECTS





- international Law, 6 ECTS
- Military Sociology and Leadership, 6 or 9 ECTS
- Mathematical Modelling, 6 ECTS

It is possible to attend one, several or all courses. A specific bilateral agreement has to be signed with the University of Turin in order to allow certification.

The programme will be confirmed for the next academic year. The CM database has been updated and the priority list of CM curricula to be updated and adapted to the standard format has been provided. Organising BOEIs are invited to attend the next LoD 8 meeting.

3. EDUROAM: Eduroam (https://www.eduroam.org/) is an association that provides Wi-Fi access and other services to universities and research centres in the EU and worldwide. At national level, every EU MS has created a consortium to which all universities can be affiliated as members, meaning that students, teachers and staff can access free Wi-Fi provided locally by other partners when they are abroad. If you wish to apply to become a new member, you are encouraged to contact your national Consortium. The University of Turin is parto f this Consortium.

d) LoD 9 - Future projects

The LOD9 chairperson, LTCOL Marcin Bielewicz, from AWL MULF has stepped down. LTCOL Rafal Niedzela, also from AWL MULF, informed the participants about the intention of his Commandant to keep the LOD9 chairperson from AWL MULF and the proposed person is Prof. Marta Wincenwicz-Bosy (presente in the meeting as invited person). The chairman of the IG informed that is mandatory for the nomination of the new LOD9 chairperson, the MULF Commandant to write a letter asking and the proposed person as to be accepted by all members of the IG.

e) LoD 11 - International Naval Semester (INS)

The LOD7 chairperson asked if all participants agreed with the proposal of the Italian Naval Academy to support the candidacy of Lt Cdr Samuele MONDINO, and if anyone disagree about the candidate. All the participants agreed with the nomination of Lt Cdr Samuele MONDINO for chairperson of LOD11.

f) LoD 14 - Research and Development





The LOD7 chairperson informed the meeting participants that the Hellenic Air Force Academy has nominated Associated Professor Ioannis TEMPLALEXIS as the chair of the R&D LoD. All the participants agreed with the nomination of Associated Professor Ioannis TEMPLALEXIS for chairperson of LOD14.

g) International Medical Semester

The chairman asked the word and updated the participants meeting on the matter of the establishment of a new LoD as na old subject and that the Hellenic Military Academy of Combat Support Officers (HMACSO) expressed its intention to lead the Medical LoD, and will therefore nominate a chair in due course, in order to be able to launch the new LoD at the September IG meeting.

4) 5th CSDP Olympiad

The LOD7 chairperson informed the participants that, in response to the preventive measures taken worldwide to intercept the spread of COVID-19, the IG, in close cooperation with Croatian Defence Academy (CDA), decided to postpone this event to early spring 2021 (8-12 March). The participants were advised to consult all details, available at http://www.emilyo.eu/olympiad.csdp. For the 5th CSDP Olympiad, the IG will not accept new participants, but those already accepted may participate, even if they have already graduated.

5) iMAF 2020

The chairman talked in the beginning of the follow-up meeting with the representatives of Nicolae Balcescu Land Forces Academy, Romania, and AWL Military University of Land Forces, Poland, and asked them to coordinate the organization of IMAF2020 and IMAF2021 due to the confinement measures put in place by EU MS to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The IMAF has been rescheduled to take place on the premises of the Nicolae Balcescu Land Forces Academy in Sibiu, Romania, back-to-back with the 48th IG meeting (30 November-4 December) and the IMAF2021 is planned to be organized by AWL Military University of Land Forces, Poland.

6) Work plan

The LOD7 chairperson informed the participants about 47th IG meeting: will take place in Brussels from 1-2 September 2020. On Monday 31 August, from 16.00 to 18.00, there will be a workshop for new IG members; all of the necessary





administrative details and documents are available at http://www.emilyo.eu/node/878. Decision on whether the IG meeting will be conducted in person or as a VTC will be made by the end of June at the latest. One important detail about accomodation was refered: for the 47th IG meeting the Royal Military Academy cannot accomodate the participants.

Draft minutes

The LOD8 group was informed by the chairman and discussed topics in accordance with the agenda and the minutes of the initial meeting (2 June), especially about the following topics:

- AWL representative was requested to nominate a replacement for the LOD9 chairperson if the academy wants to keep the lead in the LOD9. AWL will inform as soon as posible about it and about the organisation of the annual LOD9 meeting in Wroclaw:
- the group accepted the candidacies of Lt. Cmdr. MONDINO as LOD11 Chairman and Ass. Prof. TEMPLALEXIS as LOD14 Chairman;
- HMACSO will inform the IG during the next September meeting about the candidacy of a chairperson for the new LOD International Medical Semester;
- France and Czech Republic were informed about 2 main events to be organised in 2022 during their EU Presidency semesters and requested to announce their intention as soon as possible: EUMACS and 6th CSDP Olympiad (the Olympiad organisation starts in September 2020);
- the group was informed about GAREA procedure (files to be used) and recommendations.

In addition the institutes announced their offers for the new academic year as follow (all offers will be uploaded at the EMILYO webpage):

- UoD (CZ) announced that new Master Degree study programme "Security and Defence" composed of 2 semesters will include 3 common modules (Military Leadership, Defence Resources and Tactics;
- Saint-Cyr Academy (FR) announced that 3 semesters (1 Geopolitics and 1 Science in English and 1 Geopolitics in French) will be offered in Fall and 3 semesters (1 Geopolitics and 1 Robotics in English and 1 Geopolitics in French) in Spring. The residential phase will only take place if the COVID19 situation allows that. Otherwise the semesters will be conducted via e-learning. Before the Fall semester, a limited number of places for a Mountain course are available. After the Spring semester, there is also a limited number of places available for a Jungle warfare course in Guyana. Academies have to ask especially for these courses. They are not included in the semesters. A Robotics Seminar will be offered in December 2020;
- HAA (GR) informed about the international semester in Spring. It will be conducted as the previous editions in a modular way;
- AWL (PL) will offer IMLC in June 2021 and other offers will be announced soon;

LoD 10 Gender Mainstreaming meeting (VTC)

Draft minutes

The Chairperson welcomed the members of the subgroup by using the WEBEX system. All colleagues according to the initial list participated:

All participants introduced themselves and shared an information concerning to the COVID-19 spread and measures in their countries.

The chairperson informed the participants about the main points of the Initial Meeting of the IG. Messages were transmitted for the future events – part of the Initiative: EUMACS 2020, EUMACS 2021, 5th CSDP Olympiad, iMAF 2020, next IG Meeting and etc.

The members of the LoD 10 subgroup shared information of past and future events.

1. In fulfillment of one of our decisions during the discussions in LoD 10 subgroup in the 45the IG Meeting connected with the application for the Gender Project (strategic partnership) related to the gender concept and research, we informed the colleagues for successful application of the project named "Military Gender Studies Project" (MGS).

Assoc. Prof. Sofia Menezes – Erasmus+ coordinator in Military Academy in Lisboa, Portugal provided additional data related to the project. The MGS is a project to take place under KA2 of the Erasmus+ project. It is a strategic partnership among the Military Academies from Portugal (Coordinating Country), Bulgaria, Romania and Italy (Partner Countries). An application for this project was submitted last year but it was not successfully approved by the Portuguese National Agency. This year, a new application was submitted, with more data, more partners, and more support (PT MoD, PT National Defence Institute, Spanish MoD, Croatian RACVIAC Center for Security Cooperation). The application was submitted in March 2020 and results (hopefully, positive!) will be known by the end of July

The major goal of the MGS project is to gather data from different military academies of several European countries in order to undertake specific research under the field of Gender Studies in European Military Institutions. The project has three main objectives:

1. to stimulate scientific production regarding Gender Studies in the military;

- 2. to create and implement a set of common contents to be taught, initially, in each partner institution in the format of masterclasses the curricular program being the result of the scientific research and production;
- 3. to extend the masterclasses to all Military Academies in Europe by means of training trainers from each of the institutions interested in taking part in the process.
- 2. The remind for future event was announced by Assoc. Prof. Daniela Moldoveanu the Military Culture and War Experience Online , 15-17 October 2020, Bucharest, Romania. The conference will be hosted by Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I" and organized in partnership with New Bulgarian University, Sofia, Bulgaria.

In view of the current Covid-19 situation and the uncertainty regarding prospects for the coming months, the MCWE organizing committee and the MTAFI Executive have jointly decided to hold the CONFERENCE ONLINE. The organizers and a limited number of participants are, however, expected to be physically present function of the Covid-19 future regulations.

Some of the main topics in the conference are:

- Military cross-cultural competence;
- Gender, race, age and disability in the military;
- Implications of military culture and stereotypes and etc.

As one of the keynote speakers is invited the Chairperson of LoD 10 Gender Mainstreaming.

- 3. The idea to organize 3rd Erasmus Gender seminar 'How to strengthen gender perspective within the European basic officer education' was on our meeting agenda again. It was confirmed that Estonian Military Academy is still very interested in arranging of the 3rd gender seminar in Tartu. According to the Academy's representative the plan was that seminar could take place 06-08.10.2020, but because of the COVID-19 situation the request to the superiors will be this event to take place in February 2021.
- 4. The conversation for the new common module 'Gender perspectives' was connected with sharing of proposals for the content of the module.

A lot of researches and publications are available with the popular topics like "Differences between gender and sex" or "UN Resolution 1325 on Woman , peace and security and its impact on the social processes" , but additional topics could be involved as follows:

- International document of the implementation of WPS agenda;
- Key Gender Concepts;
- Gender diversity;
- Empathy, emotions and gender;
- The social media, gender and the military;
- Recruiting policies and practices in the military;
- Gender Equality in Security Sector Reform
- Gender in PSO;
- Gender-based violence

The future work will continue with the determination of the organizational elements – for example: how each academy will find a way to insert the module in its curriculum; is it possible the module to become part of the Erasmus international semester; how to arrange this module in order to be attractive for the young cadets; how to prepare academic lectures and to find experts for teaching and showing good gender based policies.

ERASMUS+ Virtual Exchange

A new European Commission project (2018-2020 pilot programme) aims to expand the reach and scope of the Erasmus+ programme through virtual exchanges. A 'virtual exchange' is defined as a technology-enabled, facilitated, people-to-people education programme sustained over a given period. The project is aimed at young people (18-30), and the virtual exchange format distinguishes itself from other forms of online learning in several ways:

- people-to-people interaction and dialogue;
- participants experiencing how to communicate and collaborate with their peers;
- soft skills (intercultural awareness, media and digital literacy, teamwork, etc.) are included in the learning goals or outcomes;
- learner-led concept

Training materials for teachers and staff and other information are available on the portal: www.europa.eu/youth/erasmusvirtual.

EDUROAM

- Eduroam (https://www.eduroam.org/) is an association that provides Wi-Fi access and other services to universities and research centres in the EU and worldwide.
- At national level, every EU MS has created a consortium to which all universities can be affiliated as members, meaning that students, teachers and staff can access free Wi-Fi provided locally by other partners when they are abroad.
- If an academy wish to apply to become a new member, is encouraged to contact the national consortium (if there is one). The University of Turin is part of this consortium.

Virtual Mobility

The University of Turin, in cooperation with the IT Army Education and Training Command and School of Applied Military Studies, has opened up a project to all partner universities of the Emilyo programme (BOEIs) during COVID-19 crisis. It provides free online university courses, all of which are part of the university's graduate and undergraduate programmes and have been designed to encourage internationalisation processes. The LoD13 members agreed with that nomination.

g) LoD10. Gender Mainstreaming

The LoD13 chairperson informed the LoD13 members that the LoD10 session is organized on 11th June 2020. More information about LoD10 progress will be available after this meeting.

h) LoD11. Naval International Semester

The LoD13 chairperson informed the LoD13 members that the current LoD11 chair, LtCdr Daniele D'ALESSANDRO, from Italian Naval Academy had to leave the IG. The Italian Naval Academy supports the candidacy of **LtCdr Samuele MONDINO**. The LoD13 members agreed with that nomination. The LoD11 session is organized on 11th June 2020. More information about LoD11 progress will be available after this meeting.

i) LoD12. Air Force International Semester

The LoD13 chairperson informed the LoD13 members that the LoD12 session is organized on 09th June 2020. A consortium of academies applied for an Erasmus+ KA2 project for financing the organization of the Air Force International Semester. More information about LoD12 progress will be available after this meeting.

j) New LoD14 Research and Development

The Hellenic Air Force Academy nominated Associated Professor Ioannis TEMPLALEXIS as the chair of the R&D LoD. The LoD13 members agreed with that nomination. A discussion took place regarding the foundation of the Research and Development LoD. Assoc. Professor Templalexis mentioned that a presentation describing this new initiative is already uploaded since the last IG. He also said that within the following days, a form will be circulated around the IG member in order to register the status of each academy regarding research activities. This will serve as the starting point for the first LoD meeting which will take place during the next IG meeting.

k) New LoD15 International Medical Semester

The LoD13 informed the group that the Hellenic Military Academy of Combat Support Officers (HMACSO) expressed its intention to lead the International Medical Semester LoD, and will therefore nominate a chair in due course, in order to be able to launch the new LoD at the September IG meeting.

4. Updates on the next EMILYO activities

The LoD13 chairperson presented information about the next EMILYO activities discussed during the initial meeting minute of the 46th IG Meeting held on 02th of June 2020 by VTC.

a) CSDP Olympiad

In response to the preventive measures taken worldwide to intercept the spread of COVID-19, the IG, in close cooperation with Croatian Defence Academy (CDA), decided to postpone this event to early spring 2021 (8-12 March). Details are available at http://www.emilyo.eu/olympiad_csdp. The IG will not accept new participants, but those already accepted may participate, even if they have already graduated. The new edition will be organized in 2022, organized by French academies or by Czech Republic academy; a decision will be taken during the next IG meeting.

b) The 47th IG Meeting

The 47th IG meeting will take place in Brussels from 1-2 September 2020. On Monday 31 August, from 16.00 to 18.00, there will be a workshop for new IG members. All of the necessary administrative details and documents are available at http://www.emilyo.eu/node/878. Decision on whether the IG meeting will be conducted face-to-face or as a VTC will be made by the end of June at the latest.

c) EUMACS 2020

Helmut Schmidt University of the Bundeswehr in Hamburg confirmed that the EUMACS 2020 will be held in the face-to-face format in Hamburg from 29-31 October 2020. Letters of invitation for the rectors/commandants will be available soon.

d) The iMAF 2020 and the 48th IG Meeting

The event was postponed due to the confinement measures put in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The event has been rescheduled to take place on the premises of the "Nicolae Balcescu" Land Forces Academy in Sibiu, Romania, back-to-back with the 48th IG Meeting. New period: 30 November-4 December 2020. More information will be available during the next IG Meeting.

e) GAREA Statistics

All the academies, members of the EMILYO Implementation Group have to fill the GAREA forms available on the EMILYO website, concerning the statistics of the students/cadets mobilities (Country Institution

Incoming Students Statistics Study Year 2019_2020) or concerning the statistics of the staff mobilities (Country Institution Incoming Students Statistics Study Year 2019_2020). The deadline is 15th of July 2020.

5. Progress of the International Technical Semester Project

- A consortium of academies (Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I", Bucharest, Romania (applicant organization), Military University of Technology, Warsaw, Poland, the Faculty of Artillery, Air Defence and Communication and Information System from Shumen of "Vasil Levski" National Military University Bulgaria, Hellenic Air Force Academy, Dekelia, Attica, Greece and Air Force Academy Salon de Provence, France) applied for an Erasmus+ KA2 project for financing the organization of the *European Common Technical Semester for Defence and Security* (EuCTS_DS).
- The objectives of the EuCTS_DS project are the development, testing and designing of a new modular curriculum for an international technical semester for defence and security, at bachelor level, common at European Union, and also the development of a network of teachers with competences in the field of technical systems for defence and security.
- The main structure of the *European Common Technical Semester for Defence and Security* would include the following modules: basic engineering; military science; electronic engineering & computer science; mechanical and aerospace engineering; interdisciplinary scientific project.
- The EuCTS_DS project will consist in 6 intellectual outputs (one/each partner institution, two/leader organization), 5 learning/teaching activities for testing the international technical semester components (one activity/each partner institution), 5 transnational meetings (one/each partner institution) and 2 multiplier events.
- The main activities of the project are organized in 9 work packages: WP1 Project management and implementation (planning, implementation, evaluation and dissemination activities, under the coordination of MTA Bucharest, based on a general work plan and action plans agreed during meetings and phone/video conferences or e-mail communication); WP2 - Professional Network in the Field of Technical Systems for Defence and Security (developed professional networks of teachers and researchers for basic engineering, military science for engineers, mechanical and aerospace engineering, electronic and computer science engineering, resulting finally a pool of lecturer); WP3 - International Technical Semester Curriculum Development (curriculum with common subjects at EU in the field of technical systems for defence and security): WP4 - International Technical Semester Subjects Description (detailed description) for each subject included in the curriculum); WP5 - Preparation of Education Materials (course support and applications prepared to be used during the learning/teaching activities in the frame of the international semester); WP6 - Interdisciplinary Scientific Project Preparation (teaching activity included in the international semester using the project based learning methodology, assuring the competencies in different engineering branches); WP7 - E-learning Platform (modern tool used to share learning materials and to support the teaching/learning activities in the international semester); WP8 - Teaching/Learning Activities for Testing the International Technical Semester (Intensive Study Programmes organized in order to test the curriculum, subject description, learning materials and e-learning platform prepared for the international semester); WP9 - Impact and Dissemination (dissemination activities organized to share the project results, including two multiplier events).
- The EuCTS_DS application form for Erasmus+ KA2 project was submitted by Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I" at Romanian Erasmus+ National Agency in order to be evaluated. At Romanian Erasmus+ National Agency level there are 48 application forms submitted, and there are financial funds for about 14 projects. The estimated date for the evaluation results is august 2020.
- In the case of EuCTS_DS acceptation, the project will start in December 2020 and will end in November 2022. Before the beginning of the project, the consortium representatives will work on the *Design and Development of the EuCTS DS Curriculum*.
- In the case of EuCTS_DS rejection, the LoD13 members will improve the application form taking in consideration also the evaluators recommendations and will apply again in March 2021.

6. Technologies in Cybersecurity Module

- The representatives of Military University of Technologies presented the progress concerning the new common module proposal "*Technologies in Cybersecurity*".
- The module description was presented to the LoD13 members in order to have feed-back.
- The module will provide specific knowledge for a student of computer science profiling in cyber war and its technical concepts and modelling strategies, software engineering elements required for cybersecurity, reverse engineering techniques, tools for technical forensics and basic elements of cryptology.
- The goals of the module: to discover and understand basic principles of functioning, structure and trouble spots of the cyber security; to be aware of specification and classification of cybersecurity threats, including technologies used in; to deepen knowledge of the practical application of particular technologies in cybersecurity and of the decision making process on selection of appropriate measures of treatment selected cyber threats; to learn about theoretical aspects of cybersecurity technologies, how to use possibilities of IT within the cyber protection systems and forecast future development and trends in cybersecurity.

- The main topics of the module will consist in: theory of cyberwar and infowar; cyberattacks and digital threats; cybersecurity aspects of mobile technologies; artificial intelligence applications; technical cyber forensic; penetration testing; software reverse engineering; introduction to cryptology; methods and tools for decision support; computer simulation tools and methods.
- The evaluation of the students will consist in *Observation* (throughout the Module students will meet with the cybersecurity technologies applications and they will discuss the given topics in the plenary and present teamwork results. During these work students will be evaluated to verify their competences) *Project* (A group project will focus on the basic description of a selected cyber threat. Students will have to select the specific set and describe the general characterization of it, as well as possibilities of application some measures to detect, contain and counteract against given threat. Students will point out main problems related to selected threat. Students can use basic methods of scientific work for realize the task) and a *final test* (written examination at the end of the module).
- The academies members of the IG will express their interest in participating at the "*Technologies in Cybersecurity*" module organization in order to improve the description module. The first module edition will be organized at Military University of Technology Warsaw in 2021.

7. Reports on Exchanges Conducted Since the Last Meeting and New Possibilities for Exchanges

a) Military University of Technology, Warsaw, Poland

- Military University of Technology Warsaw, Poland signed an agreement with University of Turin
 that allow the MUT cadets to attend the Virtual Mobility courses organized by the University of
 Turin in cooperation with the IT Army Education and Training Command and School of Applied
 Military Studies;
- Common Module Advanced Technologies in Borders Surveillance was postponed for the fall of 2020 due to the COVID-19 outbreak at the Poland and EU level. Decision on whether the module will be organized will be made by the next IG Meeting.
- Military Multinational Sports and Shooting Games 2020 edition was cancelled due to the COVID-19 outbreak at the Poland and EU level.
- The representatives of the Military University of Technology informed the LoD13 members about an interested activity for LoD13 and LoD14 community, named European defence industrial development programme: Information day (22 June 2020), Information can be found by consulting the following link: https://ec.europa.eu/growth/content/european-defence-industrial-development-programme-information-day-0_en.

b) Hellenic Air Force Academy, Dekelia, Attica, Greece

 The 2020 edition of the Common Module Common Security and Defence Policy proposed by the Hellenic Air Force Academy was cancelled due to the COVID-19 outbreak at the Greece and EU level. Information about the new edition of this event will be available during the next IG Meeting.

c) French Air Force Academy, Salon-de-Provence, France

 The 2020 edition of the Common Module Common Security and Defence Policy proposed by the French Air Force Academy was postponed to the spring of 2021 due to the COVID-19 outbreak at the France and EU level. New information will be available during the next IG Meeting.

d) Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I" Bucharest, Romania

- The International Technical Semester Defence and Security proposed by Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I" to be organized in the spring of the 2020 was cancelled due to the COVID-19 outbreak at the Romania and EU level. Next edition will be organized in the spring of 2021.
- The **Students' International Conference "CERC" 2020"** proposed by Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I" to be organized in the spring of the 2020 was postponed to the fall of 2020, due to the COVID-19 outbreak at the Romania and EU level. The 2020 edition of "CERC" will be organized in the period 04-07 November using VTC tools.
- The LoD-13 chairperson informed the LoD-13 members about the possibility to be launched a supplementary Erasmus+ KA2 call in august-september 2020 dedicated to the digitalization of higher education and scientific research. Military Technical Academy "Ferdinand I" is opened to take part in a consortium of the academies in a project proposed for this call.

e) Bulgarian Air Force Academy, Dolna Mitropolia, Bulgaria

The representatives of the Bulgarian Air Force Academy, Dolna Mitropolia, Bulgaria express the
intention to continue the collaboration of the former Bulgarian Aviation Faculty within the LoD13
and to take part in the activities proposed in the technical field. Their proposal concerning the
conferences and other activities organized by the Bulgarian academy will be uploaded on the
EMILYO website.

f) "Mircea cel Batrân" Naval Academy, Constanța, Romania
