
Proposal for a peer-accreditation mechanism (PAM) for concordance to SQF-MILOF

Proposal development process

- 1. Initiated in the first SQF-MILEG meeting JAN27, 2022; decision to develop possible courses of action for MILEG's 2nd meeting.
- 2. 3 CoA's with SWOT analysis presented at the 2nd SQF-MILEG meeting, MAY02, 2022; request for SQF-MILEG members to endorse one of the proposed CoA's.
- 3. Decision to refine the endorsed CoA on the 4th SQF-MILEG meeting, SEPT19, 2022.
- 4. Refined CoE presented at the 5th SQF-MILEG meeting, JAN26, 2023.
- 5. PAM abbreviation introduced, and decision to present the mechanism to ESDC EAB and Steering Committee at the 6th SQF-MILEG meeting APR05, 2023.
- 6. PAM presented and endorsed at the ESDC EAB meeting of 12 SEP, 2023
- PAM presented as information point at the ESDC steering committee meeting of 20 OCT, 2023

PAM: opportunity and likely benefits

- 1. Contribute to the harmonization of learning outcomes
- 2. Accumulate data about the best practices
- 3. Develop curricula based on knowledge of best practices
- 4. Contribute to building trust among institutions

Elements of the process

- 1. Mission statement, values, and visual identity
- 2. Information sharing environment
- 3. Maintenance of the expert network
- 4. Scheduling of peer-assessment events
- 5. Assessment delivery forms and guidelines
- 6. Analysis and structuration of accumulated knowledge

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
