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LoD 11 - identified issues against the initial roadmap:

- There are several different educational systems that follow up
 - radically different panels of curriculum:
 - vocational education,
 - technical/engineering orientation and
 - integrated academic programs supported by external university;
- The national curriculum is very different to cumulate 30 ECTS
 - based on agreed courses need more flexibility;
- Different subordination issues on decision making process
- Several BOEI are not registered as Erasmus+ institutions on HEI;





Launch of the International



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- Increase the INS curricular flexibility;
- Better dissemination among the partners;
- Enlarge the INS networking;
- Joint projects to be applied (focus on training and research)





a. LoD 11 – INS curricular flexibility:

- a1. by valuing the common INS courses as joint modules
- a2. by enlarging the course offer for incoming students on 3 specialties
- For a better compatibility, the INS should be centred on 3 pillars & curricular frames:
 - Navigation and Naval Equipment, Mechanical/Electric Engineering, Logistics
- The INS common courses as approved could be further implemented as joint
 - modules and distributed among the partners for content development 2
 - alternatives to implement it:
 - National level: then we can have the entire offer along 1 semester or
 - Joint level: shared modules among the partners, for 1-2 weeks, exchanging students on short time.







a. LoD 11 – INS curricular flexibility (cont.):

- More flexible course catalogue to stimulate 1 semester mobility among the
 - partners flexible ECTS recognition;
 - Use the Erasmus+ English taught courses for incoming students;
 - Interfere with Technical Semester on Engineering programs.
- Orientation toward English taught programs;
- Hybrid system for Erasmus+ joint modules implementation;
- Promote the training modules/military practical stages under placement mobilities alternatively to the study stages (easier to be harmonized) naval training network.





b. LoD 11 – INS dissemination and advertising: Is a strong need to promote the INS advantadges and the EMILYO/ERASMUS+ opportunities for our students

- Chief of Navies Seminar in Bucharest, May 2022;
- EU Naval Academies Superintendents Seminar (ENASC), Nov.2022;
- Erasmus+ inter-institutional bilateral agreements to be initiated
- Other events to be valued





c. LoD 11 – Enlarge the INS networking under EMILYO:

- New Navy BOEI to be attracted in the network (i.e. France, Germany);
- Regular guidance/assistance for Erasmus+ program to be provided for partners;
- Technical assistance provided for partners for Erasmus+ program implementation to value the opportunities;
- Online resources to be allocated to facilitate the communication.





d. LoD 11 – Joint projects to be implementer or further applied:



- MARS-NET simulators' network implementation (2022-2024);
- SEA MENTORS mentorship platform to be implemented (2022-2024);
- Integrated Training Programs Network for EU Naval Academies (future 2023);
- Common Curriculum Harmonization for Navy Education Curriculum framework development (future 2024).





New roadmap proposal – way to go:

- by June 2022 assign the courses/partners and build the working teams for designing joint modules development (up to 3 per each Academy);
- by September 2023 developing the syllabuses for 12 joint modules in working groups/ each Academy will organize up to 3 modules from the basic offer (approval in 55th IG Meeting, progress checking during 56th Meeting);
- during January-June 2023 building the course content and approving the modules organization in the academic plan for 2023-2024/partner;
- INS planned to be started as joint modules offer during 2023-2024.

Deadlines:

- June 2022 1st draft of syllabuses in INS form;
- Sept 2022 syllabuses approval, working group development, start of course development;
- Dec 2022 progress report on course content
- June 2023 course content delivered and approved;
- Sept 2023 submit the final offer modules planning and INS onset.

- Navy Tactics Module RNA/NVNA
- Navigation Simulation Module RNA

New roadmap proposal – way to go:



- by December 2023 enlarging the BOEI pool for LoD-11;
- by December 2023 enclosing bilateral IIA under Erasmus+ on

bilateral level;

- by January 2023 - project proposal for Joint Naval Training

Program – to value the common curricular frame for cadets;
