The **start@unito** program of the University of Turin, funded by Compagnia di San Paolo and aimed at finding strategies to increase the quality and the effectiveness of teaching, provides **open free online university courses**. All courses are part of the University's graduate and undergraduate programs and have been designed to encourage internationalization processes. Courses can be freely accessed by anyone, through social media and any type of device. Courses are self-paced (asynchronous modality). For those who intend to acquire ECTS credits the in-person final exam takes place at the university campus or via distance e-learning modality in accordance with University of Turin regulation for online activities.
