ADMIN DETAILS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Spanish Air Force Academy will host an International Week in San Javier, Spain. The participants are expected to arrive on Sunday, 23 October 2022 if possible before 1800 Local Time (LT) and depart, preferably before 1800LT on Saturday, 29 October 2022.

2. REGISTRATION

3. TRANSPORTATION

Participants are requested to make their own travel arrangements to and from the Alicante airport. Please send your travel plan by sending the “Transport request” to the POC **no later than 7 October 2022**.

3.1 Arrival

Delegations should arrive on Sunday, 23 October 2022 before 1800LT if possible by air at the Alicante Airport or by train at the Alicante Train station. Delegations will be greeted by cadets from the Spanish Air Force Academy who will hold a “Spanish Air Force Academy International Week” sign.

Pickup will be coordinated based on arrival time via a WhatsApp group established by designated students who will greet participants upon arrival at the airport/train station.

3.2 Departure

Delegations should leave no later than Saturday, 29 October preferably before 1800LT 2022 from Alicante Airport or Alicante train station.

Dropoff will be coordinated based on departure time via a WhatsApp group established by designated students who will transport participants to the airport for departure.

Spanish Air Force Academy will provide transportation throughout the week for every activity.

4. ACCOMODATION

Cadets and officers will be accommodated for free on base at the Spanish Air Force Academy in accordance with the Framework Agreement.

Within the academy there is laundry services available at charge, and washers are available on site, however dryers are not (clotheslines are available in the main building).

Students will stay with Spanish cadets, sharing their dorms, surrounding the “Plaza de Armas” (Parade Grounds, see Air Base map, picture 1).

Officers will be accommodated in the Officers Residence, located close to the main entrance of the Base (see Air Base map, picture 1).

5. MEALS

Spanish Air Force Academy will provide meals free of charge during the week at the dining facility **on base**.

- Breakfast is served from 0650LT - 0720LT in the Student Comedor (chow hall). Officers' breakfast will be served in the Student Comedor (annex saloon).
- Lunch is served according to the program (1515LT) in the Student Comedor. Officers' lunch will also be served in the Student Comedor (main table). On Monday, the Spanish Air Force Academy Dean of Academics (Lt Col Aguirre) and Officers will be served in the Student Comedor (annex saloon).
- Dinner is served according to the program, after the cultural events (2030LT) in Student Comedor (OPTIONAL). Dining off base, if desired, is also possible. To have all dinners in the base prepared, students must sign the dinner control list each day for the following day. These lists are available in all dorms buildings halls.
 - o Important: Officers, communicate your intentions regarding dining to Cap. Gallarín each day for the following day in order to coordinate amount of food to be prepared.

6. DRESS CODE

- Monday to Friday: Visits and tours to military facilities will be in military attire. The uniform you are asked to wear is what we call Long sleeve blues Class B uniform, women can use skirt or pants if desired.

All meals inside the Base will also be in military attire.

- Monday to Thursday: cultural visits are scheduled to take place in the evening (1700LT – 2000LT). All the cultural visits will be in civilian clothes.
- Military training will be in utility uniform (camouflage uniform).
- Sports activities will be in PT gear (sport attire) and appropriate swim wear.

Once academic activities are finished, students are allowed to wear civilian clothes outside the base.

7. ACCESS TO THE BASE / COMMUNICATION

- Once you have arrived at the Spanish Air Force Academy, you will be given an envelope containing your base passes and the updated program.
- All international cadets will be added to a WhatsApp group using the phone numbers provided on the registration form so you can be in routine contact with the group and local Spanish POCs. The group will be managed by one of the Spanish Students.

8. SAFETY MEASURES (Covid-19 related / In effect at the moment):

- All participants that come from EU member states are not required to present any kind of COVID certificate. If proceeding from non-EU member states a valid European covid-19 certificate (vaccination or recovery) or a valid Covid test (PCR or antigen test, executed not more than 48h prior to the CM) on their arrival will be required to leave the airport.
- Please check country regulations for your return travel. You may need a PLF or a PCR test (for some countries it is a requirement even for transit flights).
