Common Module on CSDP December 2013 in Wiener Neustadt / Austria Report by civilian students from the Jagiellonian University in Cracow – Poland

From 2nd to 6th December 2013, the Theresan Military Academy in Wiener Neustadt, Austria, hosted a Common Module on Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP). Within the framework of European Initiative for the exchange of young officers inspired by Erasmus, military academies from Czech Republic, Estonia, Italy, Lithuania, Romania, Poland and France sent their officer cadets to gain knowledge on CSDP as well as to create bonds with colleagues from other EU Member States. The module was a great opportunity for civilian students representing Institute of Political Science and International Relations of the Jagiellonian University in Cracow - Poland, who for the first time ever had a chance to actively participate in the module along with officer cadets from military academies.

It is worthy to mention, that not only representatives of European military academies and universities were present but also officer-cadets from United States' prestigious West Point Academy were taking part in that module.

Initially, there was some anxiety about how that civilian-military cooperation will develop. It was undoubtedly new situation for officer cadets to work with non-military students as well as for civilians it was also entirely new experience. However, it was only a matter of time for ice to break. Thanks to variety of activities organized by our hosts combined with extensive exchange of views and knowledge during lectures and workshops new acquaintances were made. The syndicate work was especially designed with immense potential for developing understanding and communication skills among participants. Being collectively responsible for fulfilling common task was a factor of great importance in creating cross-national and cross-institutional positive relations.

Besides interpersonal aspect, there was also a significant amount of information that participants were provided with. Lectures were conducted by professionals from variety of backgrounds and gave students a unique chance to better understand not only European Union's Common Security and Defence Policy but also modern military environment in which interoperability is a crucial factor. Recognition an acknowledgment of importance of cooperation between civilian and military counterparts is probably one of the main benefits one could get from that course. Besides that, participation in the module helped to improve overall level of knowledge regarding European security issues, provided opportunity to learn from experts combining high academic level with personal experience and a possibility to take part in creating new approach to civil-military cooperation in terms of education and cooperation between universities and military academies.

Organizational aspects of the Common Module should also be stressed since all activities were conducted and delivered in the highest possible manner. Everything was carefully planned in order to maximize effectiveness of learning process. It was probably effect of Austrian experience gained from organizing CSDP Module for fourth consecutive year.

Summing up, for us – civilian students – it was incredible opportunity to get in touch with people who are from different countries, represent different cultures and institutions but think in a surprisingly similar way to ours. We hope that it was just a first step on a road to develop our cooperation and exchange for mutual benefit. There is no doubt, that we can recommend participation in CSDP Common Module at the Theresan Military academy to officer cadets and civilian students as well.

In October, in the Italian Air Force Academy a brand new module will take place. It aims at promoting the understanding, implementing and future self-development of leadership capabilities through conceptual and practical activities.

Qualified military officers, university professors and talented speakers will use a holistic approach to guarantee participants a sound grasp of the effective "transformational" Leadership and cognitive primers to development and self-development of strategic leadership skills.

Teamwork and group discussions will be fostered in order to enhance a leadershiporiented mindset and ethical behaviours. In all educational activities, the learning-by-doing method will play an important role.

Moreover, concept generation through exchange of ideas, relations, transactions, networking, cultural cross-pollination will be systematically promoted to give a deeper and rich learning experience.

The active contribution of all participants will help to set up a good learning environment, building up a deeper awareness of fundamental concepts, improved skills and competences essential for further development of future leaders.

The goal is to enhance a common understanding by young officers of the essential functions and workings of Leadership and Ethics, with special reference to the military.

This common understanding should in the long term enhance the young officer's confidence in conducting military operations in national and international environment and in interacting with the broader social context.

The chosen approach to understand and analyze the complex environments will be "the complexity and chaos theory" in order to effectively operate in VUCAR (Volatile, Uncertain, Complex, Ambiguous, Rapidly Changing) domains. Fundamentals of Primal Leadership, focusing on small group dynamics and ethics will also be provided through. An anthropological interpretation of Leadership and relationships with one's own experience. Strategic Leadership will be related with the afore-mentioned theories in order to gain a better understanding and a valuable use of it.

Leadership & Agility in Complex Environments 2/2

The proposed subjects will strengthen individual values and commitment to service, to bolster organizational productivity and growth.

The course can be divided in three phases

Phase 1: Best Practices' document writing:

Every participant will be asked to write a short essay on leadership promotion ideas and practices in his own country.

The essay will be peer-graded. A dedicated environment on an internet platform will be set up and the participants will be asked to fill out a guided grading form

Phase 2: Residential phase:

Through lessons, workshops and innovative experience-based outdoor training, the self-confidence and individual capability to work in a team and in a large organization will be improved. Personal development will also be pursued. The attitude of positive thinking when faced with challenges and how to strengthen leadership and its applications will be fostered at all times in order to hone personal skills.

Phase 3: Sending the written document to participants' Nations

A final document will be written in real time through teamwork to share the results of the

work with participants' Nations for further developments.

In conclusion, it can be said that the understanding and practice of leadership at the tactical, operational and strategic level will be improved through an innovative approach, so to contribute to the conceptual promotion of the EU's comprehensive approach to military operations, the core subject in every Common Module.
