## Financing the Initiative

Participation in initiatives is not regulated through a fully standardized mechanism in terms of funding. However, it will be possible to take as an example some sources of funding that could be used to adequately finance participation, increasing activities between institutions and contributing to the creation of an increasingly common training. Funding sources may be internal to the Institution, or external, through the support of entities outside the Institution.
