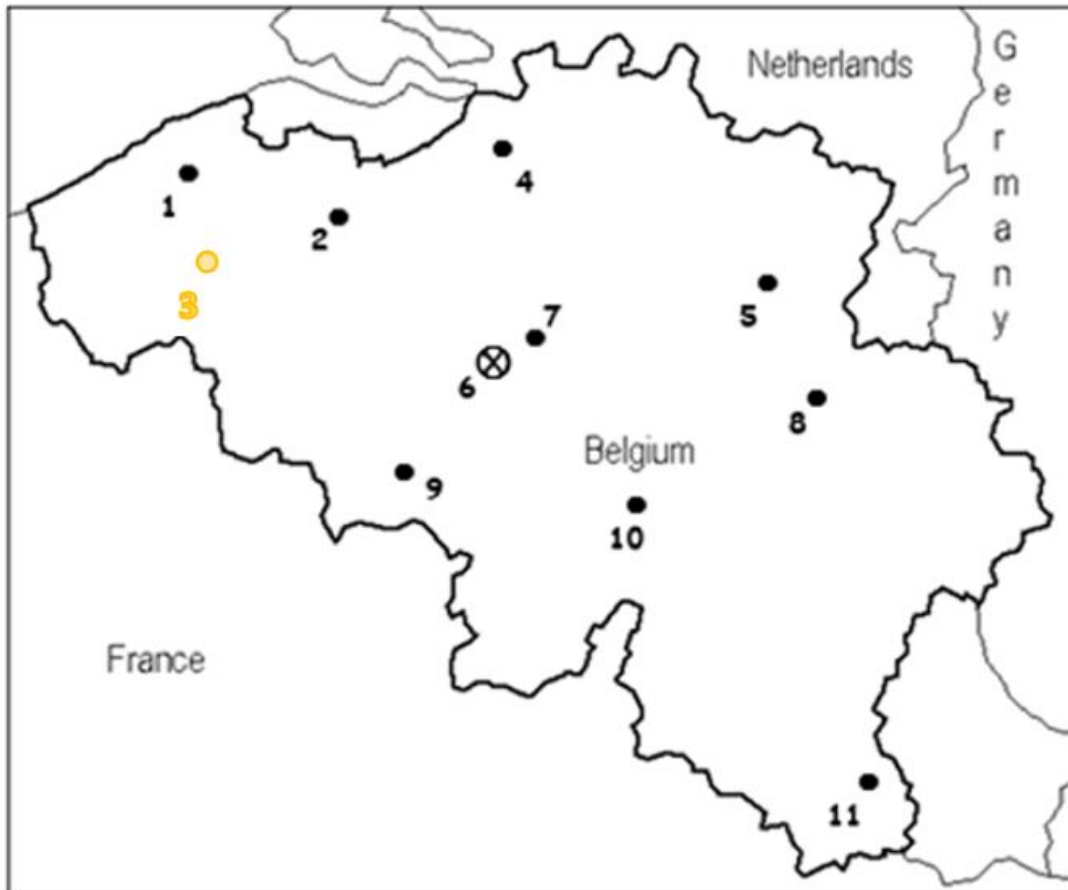

## 9 Weather expectations for May

The weather in Belgium in May is generally pleasant and mild, often considered one of the nicer spring months, although changeable conditions are still possible.

Here are the main averages for May in Belgium:

**Temperatures:** during the day, temperatures are usually between 15 °C and 21 °C. At night and in the early morning, it can still be chilly, with temperatures around 6 °C to 12 °C.

**Precipitation:** May is a relatively mild month, but expect an average of 12 rainy days and total precipitation of around 47 to 69 mm throughout the month.

**Sunshine:** there is often a fair amount of sunshine, averaging around 7 hours per day.

Tips for May:

- **Layered clothing:** the weather can vary from sunny to cool and rainy. Dress in layers.
- **Coat:** a warm coat is recommended for the cooler mornings and evenings.
- **Umbrella:** an umbrella or raincoat is not a luxury.

*Please note: In recent years (such as in 2025), May can sometimes start off very sunny and warm, with temperatures locally reaching 25-28 degrees.*

## 10 From the airport to Bruges

Bruges has no airport, so travellers typically arrive via Brussels Airport (Zaventem) or Brussels South Airport (Charleroi). Here's what to do when landing at each:

### 10.1 Brussels Airport (Zaventem)

#### **Step 1** - Train to Brussels

Inside the airport, follow signs for "TRAIN / RAILWAY STATION" (Level -1).

#### **Step 2** - Train to Bruges

From Brussels Airport → Bruges, travel time is about 1h30

with one transfer at:

Brussels-Nord, Brussels-Central, or Brussels-Midi.

#### **Tickets**

- Buy at the blue machines or via the SNCB app.
- Price: ~ € 21,00 – € 25,00 (one way).

### 10.2 Brussels South Airport (Charleroi)

#### **Shuttle Bus to Brussels Midi**

- Direct shuttle "Flibco" to Brussels-Midi station.
- Duration: 1h
- Price: € 17,00 – € 20,00

Direct Flibco bus to Bruges exists at certain times (approx. 2h15).

From Brussels-Midi → Bruges, 1h direct trains run frequently.

## 11 Local transportation

Brugge Station is 15–20 minutes away from the historical centre on foot.

Bus lines 1 and 2 take you to the centre of Bruges.

- Bus line 1 (towards "Sint-Kruis"): get off at stop 't Zand, Sint-Salvatorskathedraal, O.L.V. Kerk or Dijver.
- Bus line 2 (towards "P+R Coiseau"): get off at stop 't Zand, Sint-Salvatorskathedraal, O.L.V. Kerk, Dijver, Stadsschouwburg or Jan Van Eyckplein.
