Training was a part of the course – Military Leadership B, and was conducted by representative from the Faculty of Management and Leadership. AWL's Command Competence Development Center – "Tor Lider" was constructed in 2022 and till this day is the biggest and the most modern in the whole Europe. AWL's Command Competence Development Center covers over 2,000 square metres, has 17 tasks points. Ten teams can train at the same time under the supervision of instructors. The training group and the selected commander (one of the cadets) completed detailed tasks that they did not know before, within a specified time.

The tasks that cadets had to encounter are: transporting ammunition or weapons, through various obstacles. Participants had limited time and limited amount of materials at their disposal. To make tasks even complicated and difficult, Instructor put red elements at many points that cadets could not touch. At one of the points, cadets after the planning phase, performed all activities in complete silence. Communication took place only through established non-verbal signals. Later Instructor introduced the highest level of difficulty – cadets had to overcome obstacles in conditions of limited visibility. They were blinded by the lights. Moreover their concentration was hampered by the sounds of explosions and gunfire. The performed activities at each point were recorded and later analysed.

While performing the assigned tasks, the cadets had to demonstrate, among others: resistance to stress, accurate assessment of the situation, fast decision-making, the ability to work in a team, taking the initiative, physical fitness in action during an unforeseen situations and readiness to take responsibility for carrying out the tasks. The training was attended by representatives from 7 Partner Institutions.
