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Verification of learning outcomes:

- **Observation of behaviour**: Throughout the module, students are to involve into the given topics within syndicates and in the plenary, and present teamwork results. During these interactive tasks (discussions, case studies, debates, role-plays etc.), students are to be evaluated based on a *Performance Evaluation Grid* containing specific indicators of the expected attitudes and behaviour.
- **Project**: The group project will focus on the presentation, description, and discussion of a selected European value/set of values and its/their analysis in the national and European context. The evaluation of the projects will be done according to criteria that illustrate the students' ability to identify, analyse, compare, and explain the targeted concepts.
- **Test**: Written examination at the end of the module.
