KA131 (Higher Education) — what mobilities are funded & how the funding works (latest Erasmus+ Programme Guide)

Types of mobilities funded (what KA131 pays for)

- 1. Student mobility for studies short- and long-term study periods at a partner HEI (ECTS recognition applies).
- 2. Student mobility for traineeships (work placements / internships) traineeships at enterprises, research institutes, labs, NGOs, etc., anywhere relevant to the degree.
- **3. Staff mobility teaching** staff from a sending HEI deliver teaching at a partner HEI (visits must include teaching activities and recognition by the receiving institution).
- **4. Staff mobility training** staff attend courses, training events, job shadowing or professional development at an organisation abroad.
- **5. Blended mobilities and Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP)** KA131 funds physical + virtual ("blended") mobilities and BIPs (short intensive programmes combining online prep + a short physical phase).

Erasmus funding conclusions:

- Possibilities to organize regular mobilities for students/cadets and staff
- Focus on short-term blended mobilities for students/cadets:
- 1. Study mobilities within BIPs compulsory to award 3 ECTS and to apply for KA131 Erasmus+ funding
- 2. Short-term blended mobilities (study mobilities) compulsory to award 3 ECTS and to include a virtual component. HEIs MUST have a valid Erasmus Charter
- 3. Short-term blended mobilities (traineeship mobilities) NO NEED for ECTS, Erasmus Charter of the organizing institution NOT NEEDED. Compulsory to include a virtual component.
- International mobilities possibility to organize international mobilities to NON-EU countries up to 20% of the total Erasmus ongoing projects institutions MUST apply for this option during the open calls for Erasmus KA131 projects.

A KA131 project's budget for European mobility can include a limited share used for outbound mobility to non-associated third countries (the Guide/Agreement caps this — e.g., up to 20% may be used for international mobilities under certain conditions). Check the project's Data Sheet / Annex for exact percentage used in your grant. <u>Erasmus++1</u>





Transfer Possibilities

• Institutions can transfer funds between categories:

Student ↔ Staff mobility

Study ↔ Traineeship mobility

• Ensures full budget utilization and adapts to demand

Key Takeaways!!

- Short-term mobilities are flexible, inclusive, EU-funded
- Financing covers travel + daily support
- Institutions can reallocate funds between categories
- Supports both students and staff
