# SYMBOLISM OF THE MARTENITSA



## Color Symbolism

**Red:** life and protection, **white** symbolizes purity and new beginnings, embodying harmony and balance.

## Protective Charm

Martenitsas are believed to ward off evil spirits and illnesses during seasonal transitions, offering spiritual protection.

## Cultural Figures

The figures **Pizho** and **Penda** symbolize male and female energies, fertility, and the continuity of life in Bulgarian folklore.

## Community and Tradition

Exchanging Martenitsas fosters cultural connection, shared values, and a sense of community in Bulgarian culture.

## **HOW BULGARIANS CELEBRATE THE TRADITION**



### **Spring Symbols and Removal**

Martenitsas are worn until sighting spring signs like storks, swallows, or blossoming trees.

### **Rituals for Removed Martenitsas**

Removed Martenitsas may be tied to trees, placed under stones, or thrown into rivers for good fortune.

### **Cultural Celebrations**

Markets and stands sell Martenitsas, keeping the tradition alive in Bulgaria and abroad.
