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

Discussion on Cadets Behavior

- There were some incidents in all the academies concerning cadets' behavior last year
- Observations
 - The cadets were not coming to attend the lectures
 - They were failing to follow the rules of the hosting academy
 - They had demands to receive the same treatment as in the home academy while the objective of the Internationalisation is to “live/survive” in a different environment



Discussion on Cadets Behavior

- Decisions Made:

- **Code of Conduct Handbook**

- Collaboratively develop a comprehensive handbook titled "Code of Conduct and Responsibilities for International Exchanges" (or similar)
 - Document expected cadet behavior, cultural sensitivities, and professional standards while representing their home academy abroad
 - Provide guidelines for adapting to host country customs and military requirements



Discussion on Cadets Behavior

- Decisions Made:

- Academy Information Presentations**

- Each participating academy will create a detailed orientation presentation covering:
 - Daily schedule and routine
 - Academic curriculum and teaching methodologies
 - Accommodation facilities and amenities
 - Sports and recreation facilities
 - Local area information and available services
 - Practical logistics (dining, transportation, communication)

- Purpose:

- Enable visiting cadets to familiarize themselves with living conditions and expectations prior to arrival



Physical Education Program

- Three ideas were presented regarding the development of a common physical education program
- The ideas will be discussed internally and then a VTC meeting will be organized with all the physical education instructors from the participating academies to discuss further details



Syllabi alignment with SQF-MILOF

- All syllabi have been revised by the instructors to address the difference in the number of working hours (60 min) versus lecture hours (45 min) that was previously used in each syllabus
- LoD-1 Chair (Tom Simoens) has reviewed the syllabi and suggested to use the new Common Module Template
- The syllabi will be prepared for approval in the next IG meeting at Riga
