



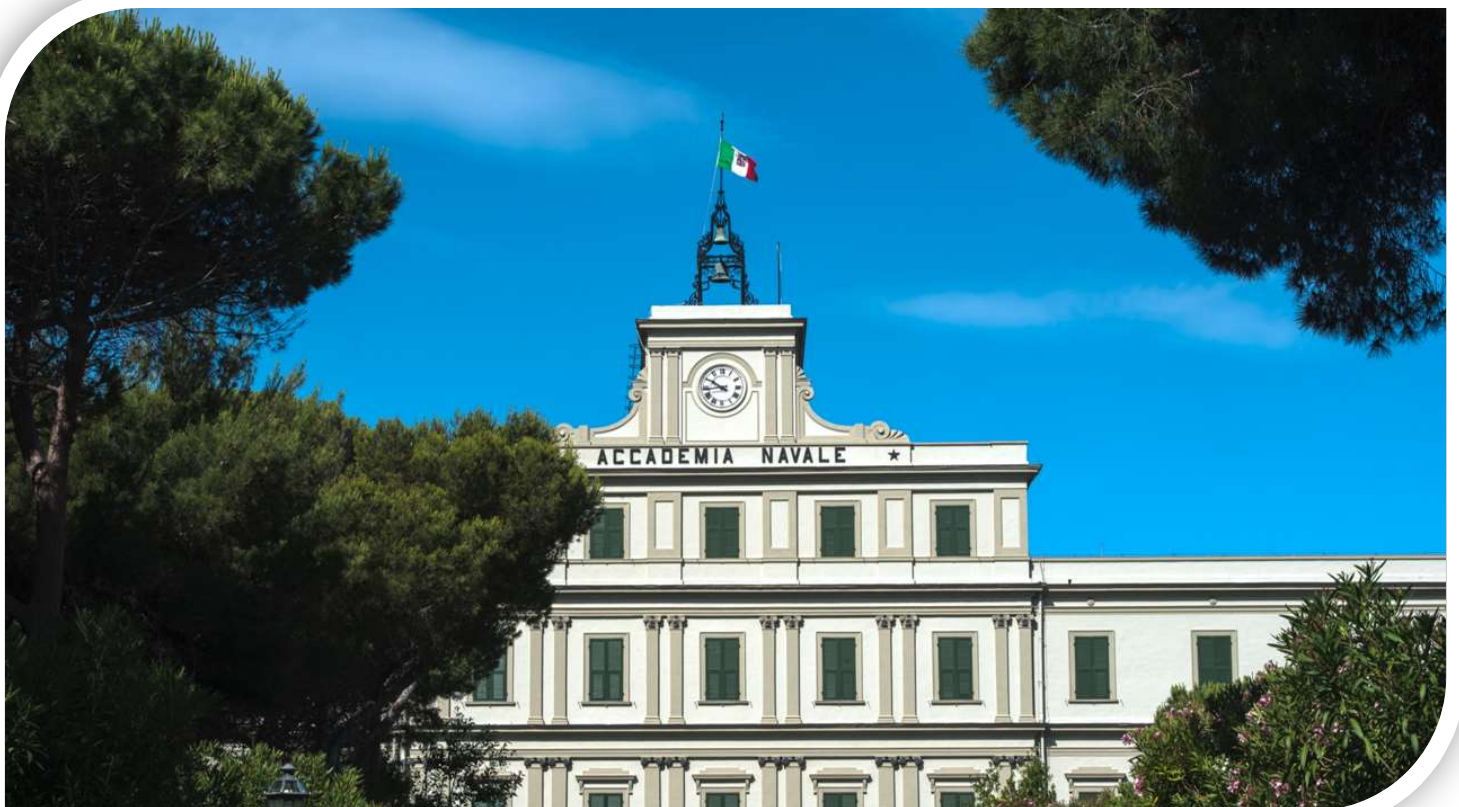

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Pre-conditions

- Only military Officer Cadets/Midshipmen – with an appropriate military background – are eligible to participate in the entire International Naval Semester. Exceptions will be addressed on a case-to-case basis.
- Officer Cadets' pre-conditions for participation in the semester are:
 - English language requirements according to following point 1.2.;
 - Suitability for physical activity assured by the belonging Institution;
 - Basic managerial, communication and leadership skills;
 - Basic negotiation and problem solving skills;
 - Ability to plan, organize and accept responsibility;
 - Basic knowledge of using computers.
- There is no participation of civilian students in the semester.
- Military Officer Cadets/Midshipmen may attend one or more *one-week* classes/modules according to following point 2.1.

1.2. Language

- The entire International Naval Semester is held in English language.
- The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) Level B1 or NATO STANAG Level 2 is highly recommended (but not mandatory) for Cadets' participation.

1.3. Contents/Duration

- The International Semester is worth 26 ECTS (30 with Military Leadership C – physical training) and lasts 3 months. This fulfils the requirements for ERASMUS+ support.
- Moreover, all the Common Modules, which are an integral part of the Italian accreditation, are also part of the International Naval Semester.
- Almost Every Module will include a Field Study
- Almost Every Week End, a Cultural trip will be arranged by Naval Academy (Florence, Pisa, Livorno, Siena-San Gimignano, Bolgheri ecc.)

1.4. Applications and Registration

- Please use the attached editable application form (typing in block letters) in Annex 1 (if you do not know your flight information at this stage you can send them later) and send it to POCs according to point 1.10 (marinaccad.international@marina.difesa.it and in copy carbon to simone.giusti@marina.difesa.it and gennaro.panzarino@marina.difesa.it).
- **Last date for registration is 10 July 2026.**
- Dates:
 - The International Semester starts on **21 September 2026** and ends on **18 December 2026**.
 - Arrival day: **20 September 2026** (not earlier, not later) or the day before the module attended.
 - Departure day: to be arranged on a case-to-case basis after the last classes.
- A mixture of Countries/Institutions is instrumental in increasing the intercultural competences; consequently, a maximum of 40 foreign Cadets (2 per Country) is allowed (more Cadets in particular cases on a case-to-case basis).
- Participation will be assigned on the basis of the order in which reservations are received and on the basis of the following priorities:
 - EU Countries;
 - participation in the whole semester;
 - participation in single module.
- The procedure for the assignment of places is: first replay – first booked.

1.5. Accommodation & Meals

- According to EMILYO-LoD 5 (framework), accommodation, meals, and other expenses in relation to the education are provided free of charge for members of European Union Basic Officer Education Institutions (<https://www.emilyo.eu/lod-5-framework>).
- For Non-EU Members the rules follow bilateral regulations and contracts.
- No course fee is required.

1.6. Permission for Stay

- According to national Italian rules/law, the permission to stay shall be requested via the sending Institutions' Country national (military) diplomatic chain of command.

- A “Request for Visit (RfV)” is to be submitted via the sending country’s authorities to the sending country’s embassy in Italy.
- Without this procedure, unfortunately, Officer Cadets/Midshipmen will not receive permission to stay by the Italian Defence Staff, thus preventing their participation in the International Semester or one-week module.

1.7. Transportation

- Participants are requested to make their own travel arrangements **to/from Pisa International Airport (PSA)** or **to/from Livorno train central station**.
- The Italian Naval Academy will provide free transport from the PSA to the Academy and back. A representative from the Italian Naval Academy will meet the participants at the Arrival Terminal of PSA, according to the flight schedule.

1.8. Uniform/Dress Code

- In accordance with the dress code in force within the Italian Naval Academy, shorts and denim trousers are not allowed. For detailed information, see Annex 3 and NATO publication “The strategic Commanders’ guide to protocol”.
- The following clothes are authorized:
 - arrival/departure and short leave: Informal/Casual/Very casual
 - opening/closing ceremony: Ceremonial Dress and Service Uniform
 - courses: Working Dress uniform (no tie) or Field Dress
 - sports activities: Own Academy shorts, t-shirt and tracksuit¹

1.9. University of Pisa and ECTS recognition

- Those who participate in the entire semester, **before arrival**, shall submit an application as follows:
 - connect to the University web site – Incoming students:
<https://unipi.erasmusmanager.it/studenti/>.
 - click on “Practical information for mobility students” link and sign in at “ALICE Portal”.
 - on the same web page of incoming students, complete and submit the University of Pisa “Application form” in which they will be asked to upload the Learning Agreement before the mobility and receive the validation from the University Erasmus coordinator.

¹ It is possible to bring technical sports clothing and equipment for practicing the sports listed in Annex 2.

- For single/multiple modules application, midshipmen/cadets are considered by the University of Pisa as “visiting students” and accreditation on Alice Portal is not necessary.
- Italian Naval Academy will communicate the results of the exams and the ECTS to the PoC reported in the Application form forwarded.

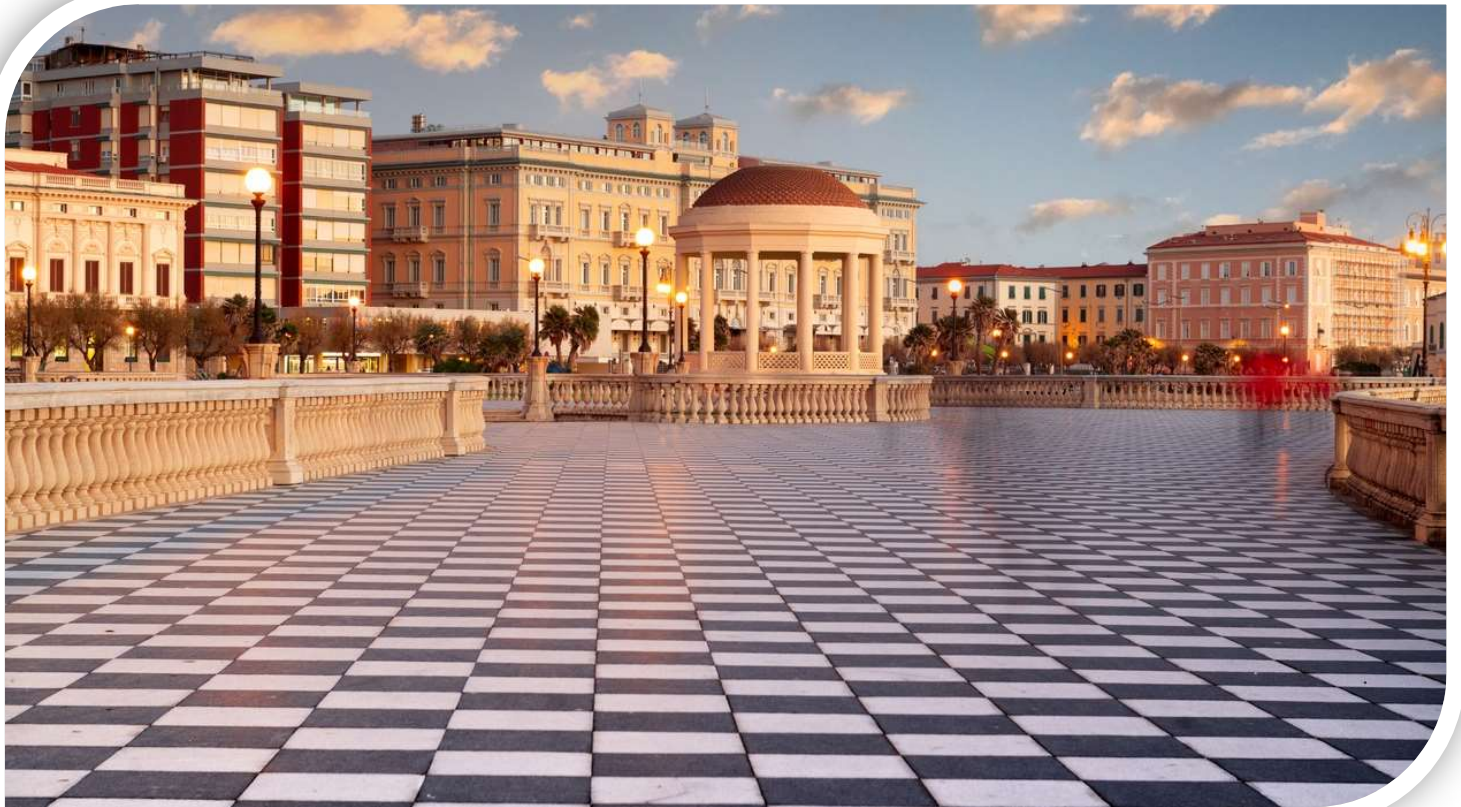

LIVORNO AND SURROUNDINGS



Livorno

Livorno is the most important seaport city in Tuscany close to the towns of Viareggio, Cecina and Castiglioncello. Ever since its founding, dating back to the 11th century, it's always stood out for being a cosmopolitan and multicultural city. Here you can have a walk on the promenade that stretches for 7 km along the seaside or decide to lose yourself in Quartiere Venezia, a district entirely built on a network of waterways and bridges like Venice itself, spotted with excellent restaurants and wine bars.



Pisa

The city of Pisa, only 20 km away from Livorno, is famous all around the world for its leaning tower, situated in Piazza dei Miracoli. The city houses three of the most important universities in Italy: the University of Pisa, Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna and Scuola Normale Superiore located in the beautiful historical building in Piazza dei Cavalieri, once the headquarters of the Naval Academy of the Knights of Saint Stephen.



Lucca

Lucca is famous for its city walls perfectly preserved and dating back to the renaissance. On the top sits a promenade, often hosting fairs and open air markets. Inside the walls you can visit the many churches, Torre Guinigi, a tower housing a garden of olive trees right on its top, Piazza Anfiteatro which used to be an ancient roman arena or also take a breather from all the sightseeing and go shop hopping along Via Fillungo.



Firenze

One of the most beautiful cities in the world, second to Rome only, it is the biggest and most populated city in Tuscany and the capital of art and architecture, just one and a half hours away from Livorno. Don't miss to visit Santa Maria del Fiore with its frescoed dome, or the Uffizi Gallery where you can see some of the greatest masterpieces of all time. Take your time to wander around the alleys and discover the array of statues in Piazza della Signoria. Go have a look inside the sparkly windows of goldsmiths on Ponte Vecchio on the Arno river, walk around the gardens of Boboli and climb up the stairs to Piazzale Michelangelo to enjoy the breathtaking view of the city at your feet.



Transportation Between Livorno, Lucca, Pisa and Florence

- **By Train:** The most efficient way to travel is by train. Livorno Centrale offers regular direct connections to Pisa in about 15-20 minutes, while reaching Lucca requires a transfer in Pisa. Florence is approximately 1.5 hours away by train, with frequent departures throughout the day.
- **By Bus:** CTT Nord operates regional bus services, though they are generally slower than trains. Buses connect Livorno with Pisa, Lucca and Florence, but schedules vary, so checking ahead is recommended.
- **By Car:** Renting a car provides flexibility, especially for exploring the countryside. The highway network is well-developed, with the A12 motorway linking Livorno to Pisa and the FI-PI-LI expressway connecting Pisa to Florence. Parking in city centers can be challenging, so using park-and-ride facilities is advisable.
- **By Taxi:** Taxis are available in major cities, but they can be expensive for intercity travel.

- Emergency services: in case of an emergency, dial 112 for police, ambulance, or fire assistance.

- Airport information:
 - Pisa Galileo Galilei Airport (PSA) is the main international airport in the region, with frequent flights and easy train and bus connections.
 - Florence Airport (FLR) offers flights to major European destinations and is connected to the city via tram and taxi services.
- Bike rentals: Lucca, in particular, is a great city for cycling, with many rental options available near the city walls.
- Public transportation tickets: train tickets can be purchased at stations, online, or via the Trenitalia app. Bus tickets should be bought in advance online, at tobacco shops or authorized vendors.

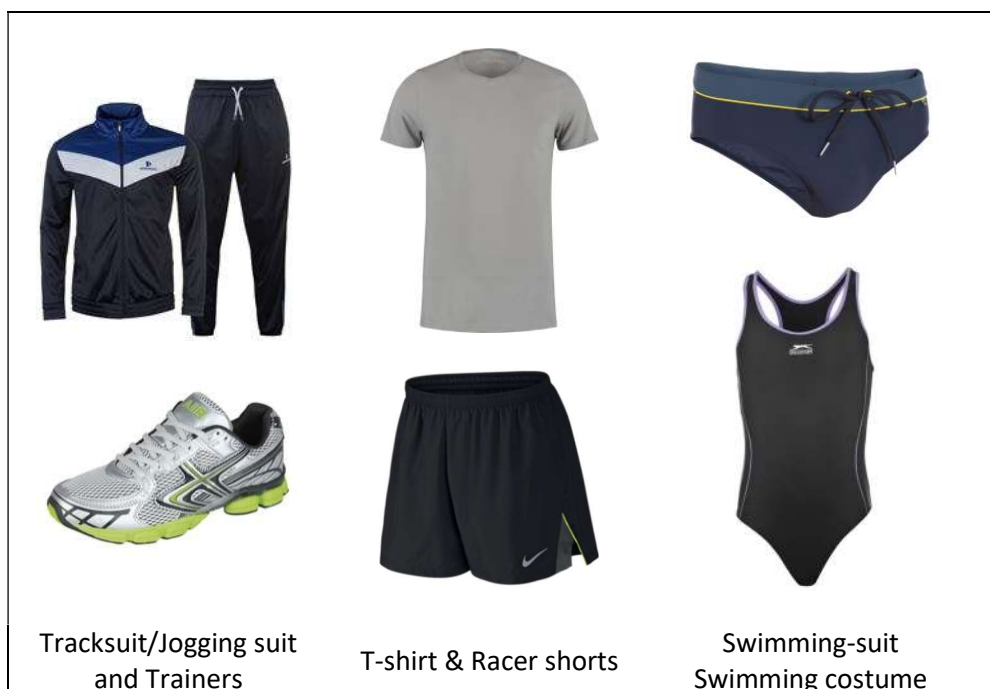
